What We Stand For

Since 1999 the Amadeu Antonio Foundation has been working in numerous ways to strengthen a democratic civil society in order to resist right wing extremism. Over the last decade a youth culture of right wing extremism has developed particularly in the Eastern part of Germany. Neo-Nazi and other right wing organisations with racist and anti-Semitic propaganda enjoy ongoing popularity. Their message is embedded in a culture of supposedly »apolitical« music, comics and video games that celebrates the »superiority of the German race« and glorifies violence against minorities. This culture has permeated schools, pubs, soccer stadiums, discotheques and other public places. Many teachers and parents are indifferent at best or implicitly approve of their children's actions and rhetoric. The Amadeu Antonio Foundation supports local projects and initiatives, which stand up against anti-Semitism and racism and stand for a democratic society and the protection of minority rights. The Foundation provides financial support, training and workshops to help these initiatives to grow, to mobilise and to network.



Still Swimming Against The Tide

Contrary to reports in the media right wing extremism in Germany has not abated. In many regions in the Eastern part of the country, but also in a growing number of towns in the Western part, right wing violence is an omnipresent threat for everyone who is of non-German ethnic origin. Neo-Nazis and other right wing gangs have designed numerous areas as »no-go zones« for immigrants, Jews, gays, handicapped and homeless people or for those who demonstrate their affiliation to an alternative youth culture. Wearing a Hip-Hop outfit or listening to rap music can be hazardous to your health in certain neighbourhoods. Since its inception the Amadeu Antonio Foundation has been able to support a growing movement of democratic grass-roots initiatives. These initiatives are essential to challenge the dominant right wing culture in many towns and communities. However, these grass roots groups do not only face potential harassment from right wing organisations. On many levels government authorities still deny the seriousness of the problem. In recent years and months many projects have suffered severe funding cuts by the government.



Support Of Projects

As mentioned above the Amadeu Antonio Foundation provides money, training and networking opportunities for a variety of projects: legal aid organisations for victims of right wing violence; watch dog groups to prevent police abuse against immigrants; training workshops for teachers; events such as music concerts and theatre performances; cooperation programmes between ethnic German teenagers and young immigrants. Moreover, the Amadeu Antonio Foundation supports »EXIT«, a unique project for members of right-wing organisations, who want to drop out. Continuous support also goes to the »Zentrum Demokratische Kultur (»Centre for Democratic Culture«), which observes and analyses new trends and strategies among right wing organisations and develops counter strategies.

History Of The Foundation

The Foundation was named after Amadeu Antonio Kiowa, a black contract worker from Angola, who was beaten to death by skinheads in a small town in Brandenburg in 1990. He was one of the first fatalities of a surge of racist violence right after the fall of the Berlin Wall.



The Amadeu Antonio Foundation is under the auspices of Mr. Wolfgang Thierse, president of the German parliament, the Bundestag. Anetta Kahane is the chairwoman of the board.
